Communication and Language Story vocabulary and early writing shapes/letter formation

- Re tell a familiar story to peers and adults using puppets and role play.
- Join in with repeated phrases in stories.
- Practise prewriting shapes and letter formation.
- Draw/colour a character from a story and colour it including masks stick puppets and zig zag books.
- Write and recognise own name.
- Enjoy books, rhymes, and familiar stories.

Key YR skills:

Enjoy listening to and joining in with stories.

Use a wider range of story vocabulary.
Describe story events with increasing detail.

Communication and language Literacy (Reading)

- Guided reading in groups x3 weekly
- Phonics- Little Wandle
- Talk about familiar stories.
- Build a bank of phonics sounds.

Maths- White Rose

- Explore numbers 0-5 and their different representations.
- Experiment sorting objects into groups of corresponding colours, size or shape.
- Subitizing (Knowing two on a dice represents 2 without counting)
- One to one correspondence.
- One more/one less.
- Position and simple shape work.

Key Reception skills:

Develop and recognise 3 objects (subitizing)
Say one number for each item up to and including 0-5 and then 0-10.

Compare quantities using language of more, less and equal through play and concrete objects.

Compare and contrast objects according to colour, size and shape in real life contexts and through practical activities.

Simple position talking about in front, behind and next to.

Select shapes for appropriate uses, a roof for a house.

Knowledge and understanding of the world.

Key Reception skills:

Ask simple questions about the world and its features including animals, nature, and other living creatures.

Explore different vehicles and begin to use and identify between the past and present.

Acknowledge beliefs of different communities and explore the world beyond immediate family.

Explore different uses for technology and talking about what technology we have in our homes including appliances.
