Join in with repeated phrases in stories. Enjoy books, rhymes, and familiar stories with increasing recall and choose own books based on interests. <p>Key Reception skills: Enjoy listening to and joining in with stories. Offer own ideas and make predictions. Make up own endings to stories. Use a wider range of story vocabulary. Describe story events with increasing detail and write some simple sentences. Listen with attention and ask relevant questions to poems, rhymes and stories.</p> <p>Links to physical – moving and handling. Pencil control and fine motor Develop some early handwriting skills. Build a bank of phonics sounds and read words linked to phonic phase. Answer simple questions about a story to show understanding, make predictions and own endings. Distinguish between fiction and non- fiction. <p>Literacy (Writing)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write in real life contexts – shopping lists, menu’s, tickets. Fiction and non-fiction writing. Draw/colour on small and large scale outside. Fine and gross motor including challenges set by adults. Write and recognise own name independently. Begin to spell some words by linking to sounds. <p>Key skills Use a wider range of story vocabulary. Describe story events with increasing detail and write some simple sentences for pleasure with increasing independence. Make links between letter sounds and words.
