It has been lovely to welcome your children back to school after the holidays and we are all looking forward to a new term of learning.

Times Tables

As you know, Year 4 is the year of the big times tables test. We aim for all our children to achieve at least 90% on this. Our Maths this term moves from multiplication and division onto fractions and decimals, all of which are highly reliant upon a sound grasp of the times tables. If this is a weak area for your child, please work away at these at home. Ten minutes a day could make a huge impact. The link below has information about the times tables test.

Reading

Reading is a crucial skill. Please hear your child read at least 3 times a week. Practise re-reading texts and passages as well to develop fluency. If your child is struggling with motivation, try reading alternate pages with them. Please also read to your child as this helps them learn new vocabulary which they can then use in their writing.

There is a weekly whole-school reading challenge where the class with the highest percentage of completed reading records receives additional 15 minutes playtime along with a trophy for the class which is awarded in assembly.

Homework

The days are changing from last term as homework club will now be on a Wednesday. Homework will be given on a Wednesday, to be completed and handed in by the following Wednesday.

Homework diaries will be handed in on a Wednesday also.

<u>Spellings</u> (30 minutes): booklet to be completed and spellings to be learned (Test on Thursday)

<u>Reading</u> (20 minutes): At least three times a week, with an adult regularly signing and noting comments in Homework diary, please!

<u>Times tables</u> (30 minutes): Children will be told which to focus on (test every other Wednesday). We have a big national times tables test at the end of Year 4, so please do keep practising these regularly at home!

<u>English and Maths</u> (30 minutes on alternate weeks): Written work to be completed in Homework book and handed in on Wednesday, online activities to be completed by Wednesday.

Please sign the completed homework to indicate that you have seen it being done.

Please remember that children should keep their homework/reading diaries in their book bags so that they are always in school. PE is on a Tuesday and Thursday however, PE kits should also be in school at all times. Please check regularly that everything is labelled. Thank you.

Stationery

<u>Pencil cases</u> As we start a new term, please ensure that the children have all the necessary equipment to support their learning.

To clarify, each clear pencil case should include a glue stick, pencil, pen, 30cm ruler, scissors, pencil sharpener, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen and a rubber.

Children having key stationery in their pencil case, such as a whiteboard pen, glue stick and ruler as well as a writing pen/pencil really does make a difference to each lesson. It allows learning start quickly and children do not waste time trying to borrow from a friend. Please talk to your children about their stationery and whether anything needs replacing.
